which I Purchased of Hardy Potts him & his heirs forever

Item I give and bequeath unto my son William Harris one Negro Boy
named Sam to him and his heirs forever

It is my will and desire is that after my wife decease or married for all time

Personal Estate in negroes & goods if any I now have to be equally divided between
my two sons and two daughters to wit William Joseph Paternoster Valley Harris
and John and their heirs forever.

Lately I make and state certain words apposed my Name wife Rebecca Harris my body
and Sole Executrix of my Last will and Testament making of reasonableness & good
Mind all other will or Wills by her hands or otherwise made or declared in the time whereof
I have been gone to set my hand and seal this day of Sept 1773.
