named Sam to him and his heirs forever
Item My will and desire is that after my wife decease or married for all my

Personal Estate and negro ~~children~~ and if any increase to be equally divided between
my two sons and two daughters to wit William Joseph Patience W. Melly Harris to
them and their heirs forever

Lastly I make constitute ordain and appoint my Loving wife Rebecca Harris my sole
and Sole Ex^r of this my Last will and Testament revoking & disannulling & making
Void all other wills or Wills by her hitherto made or declared in Writing whereby
I have hereto set my hand and seal this day of Sept 1771
