the part wherein I live dwell to him and his heirs and assigns
I also give to my said son Samuel Carroll my silver ^{stick}

I also give and bequeath to my loving son Thomas Carroll the
other part of my land beginning at the run of Terripton Branch
the first run below the Spring thence up the stream to the head
thereof thence a straight course to John Dailys line of land where
a path crosses to him the said Thomas Carroll & his heirs &
assigns for ever I also give to my said son Thomas Carroll
one pair silver steel Buttons

I also give and bequeath to my loving daughter Lucy Carroll
the sum of five pounds current money of Virginia to be raised
out of my estate or otherwise a feather bed and furniture
instead thereof if it may be my said daughter Lucy Carroll I
also give to my said daughter Lucy Carroll one pair silver steel
Buttons the afore said articles I give to her heirs and assigns
for ever

I also give the remainder part of my estate to my loving wife
Carroll during the time of her life and after her death I give
the same to my said daughter Lucy Carroll and her heirs and assigns
for ever I also give to my said daughter Lucy Carroll one pair silver steel
Buttons

a pair of shoes to him & I also give to my said son Thomas Canell
a signet ring & a pair of silver Buttons

I also give and bequeath to my loving daughter Lucy Canell
the sum of five pounds current money of Virginia to be raised &
convenient of my estate or otherwise a feather bed and furniture
instead thereof & it may be my said daughter Lucy Choate I
also give to my said daughter Lucy Canell one pair silver Buttons
the afore said articles I give to her & a ring for ever

I also give the remainder part of my estate to my loving wife Rebecca
Canell during the time of her life & after her death the same
in the marriage & death of my said wife Rebecca Canell that said
estate shall descend to my said daughter Lucy Canell
Charles Canell Elizabeth Canell Peter Canell and Prescilla
Canell to be equally divided amongst the afore said daughter
and for their equal parts to be theirs and their heirs forever

It is also my will and desire that my son Samuel Canell
shall pay to my said son Thomas Canell five pounds towards the
improving the said Thomas Canell when he the said Thomas
Canell arrives to the age of twenty one years
