In the name of God Amen. I Thomas Day of the parish of Saint Luke and County of Southampton being Sick and weak of Body but of sound and disposing Mind & memory thanks be given to Almighty God for the Same do make and constitute this my last Will & Testament in form & manner following to wit

I lend the Use of all my Lands of which I am now possessed containing Six hundred and fifty Acres more or less with the appertinances unto my loving Wife Elizabeth during her life or widowhood but at her death my said Marriage was so that it shall be sold at publick Sale and the Money arising therefrom be equally divided betwixt my five following

17 Children namely Elizabeth Briggs Francis, Thomas Day Anne
Francis Dupree and Mary Day and my desire further is that if
either of my before named Children should die without heirs lawfully
begotten that the part hereby to them given be equally divided betwixt
the surviving ones.

I give and bequeath unto my Son Thomas Day all my wearing
Apparel of every kind.

I give and bequeath unto my Daughter Anne Francis the sum of
Twenty pounds Current Money.

I give and bequeath unto my daughter Mary Day the sum of eight
Pounds Current Money.

I give and bequeath unto my grand daughter Sarah Francis
one Cow and Calf.

I give and bequeath unto my Daughter Elizabeth Brown
Day Phoebe and Charlotte to each of them respectively the sum of
four pounds Twelve Shillings and Six pence Current Money
And if either of my said Daughters Elizabeth Brown Day Phoebe
or Charlotte should die without heirs lawfully

Thebe and Charlotte or such of them as shall be then living
Lastly I do appoint my Wife Elisabeth and my friend George
Gurley whole and Sole Executors of this my last will and
Testament allowing them five £^s for there Trouble in selling
the same hereby revoking all will by me before made and Consti-
tuting and confirming this and none other to be my last will
and testament In witness whereof I have hereunto set my
