a tall pine on John Bussell's to a pine in W. Laugon's line near a long  
pen that I made to him & his heirs for ever

I Give to my son Thomas Westbrook the remainder of my last estimate

I Give to my son Thomas Westbrook the same to him & his heirs for ever

a tall from in John Bussell to a person in W<sup>m</sup> Laugherline near a bog  
pen that I made to him & his heirs for ever

I Give to my son Thomas Westbrook the remainder of my lands estimated  
at seventy five acres & bound by the afore said to him & his heirs for ever

I Give to my daughter Mary a son or heirs I Give to my daughter  
Caleb and his heirs I Give to my son Wheel my quartering collar & all
