 give to my said wife to have for her
 life and to bequeath to my son, Jonathan, my plan-
 tation whereon William Drury is now overseer with all
 the land & hold adjoining the said plantation & the
 plantation whereon John live with all the land I
 hold adjoining the said plantation on both sides of the
 three tracts except that part which I have lent to
 wife during her life and that after her death with
 the following negroes Bristol, Jarry, George, Thomas, George
 Bateck, Jacob and David also ten breeding cows and

that I give to my said son and his heirs forever.
