Further I give to my wife the use of my two Negroes Dick & Peter during her life & after
her death my will and Desire is that my daughter Mary Willon may have the use
of Peter & Dick may be ^{with her son} Barnaby Bailey and the other with my son John Bailey
Further I give unto my loving wife all my household and kitchen furniture
my stock of cattle Hogs & Sheep & that shall not be hereafter disposed of by me
to her use forever

Then I Give unto my son Barnaby Bailey negro man Tom and my Carpenters Tools
over and above what I have already given him Possession of

Item I Give unto my son John Bailey the Plantation whereon he now lives with 200 Acres land adjoining the same to him and his heirs forever I Give unto my son John Bailey my Neg. Man Abraham with all the Estate already given him in possession to himself and his heirs forever

Item I Give unto my daughter Mary Mellons Ten Pounds Current Money and Cows & Calves over and above what I have already Given her in Possession

Item I Give unto my daughter Sarah Booth Twenty two pounds Current money & Cows and Calves over and above what I have already Given her in Possession

Item I Give unto my Grand Daughter Lucy Lane Twenty Shillings Current Money

Item I Give unto my Grandson James Booth Twenty Shillings Current Money

Item I Give unto my Grand Daughter Lucy Blane Twenty Shillings Current money

Item I Give unto my Grandson William Booth Twenty Shillings

Item I Give unto my Grandson Michael Booth Twenty Shillings

Item I Give unto my Grand Daughter Sarah Booth Twenty Shillings

Item I Give unto my Grand Daughter Polly Booth Ten Pounds one Feather Bed and furniture
