sound ^{& disposing} mind and memory & calling to mind the uncertainty of this mortal
body & that it is appointed for all men to die think proper to make constitute
and Ordain this my last will and testament in manner & form following to wit
Item I give devise and bequeath to my Son William Beale the plantation and
land ~~land~~ whereon I now live to him and his heirs forever but if he should
die without heir then I give it my Son John Beale and his heirs for ever
I also give to my Son William One Iron pot One feather Bed & furniture
one Cow & calf One ewe & lamb one Sow and Poles & one Gun one pewter
dish & one earthen dish Six pewter plates one bay horse that he already has
Six pewter spoons One Tea & hoc and no more of my estate
I give and devise & bequeath unto my Dear loving wife Lucilla Beale one
third part of land during her widowhood and In case she should marry then
the whole to my Son William one feather Bed and furniture one wooden chest
Item I give and devise & bequeath to my Daughter Patty Beale one feather
bed & furniture one Chest & wooden chest one loom all the gear belonging
to it to her and her heirs forever I also give her Single life my plantation
Item I give Devise and bequeath unto my Son John Beale twenty pounds
current money of Virginia to be paid made out of my estate

I give devise and bequeath unto my Son Burwell Beale twenty Pounds Current money to be made out of my Estate all the Rest of my Estate to be Equally divided Amongst my daughter Patey Beal Son John Beale & Burwell Beale And lastly I do hereby Nominate and Appoint my wife Priscilla Beale & my Son William Beale to be Executors to this my last will and testament As witness my hand and Seal the 17th day of April 1778
