years I do give and dispose of the same in the following manner

I leave the use of all the land which I hold which is three hundred
and twenty five acres to my loving wife Elizabeth Bittle
during her life after her death I give the said Land to my son
William Bittle and his heirs forever He who shall have the same

of my negro man back to loving wife during her life and after
her death I give the said negro to my son William Bittler if he
have father. I likewise give my loving wife the bed that is
called her bed and all the furniture belonging to it to her
and her heirs forever, I likewise give my son Fanny Bittler
my new Bed and all the furniture belonging to it to her and
her heirs forever, I likewise give my son Wm Bittler the
bed that is called his bed and all the furniture to her and her
heirs forever, I likewise give my loving wife four plates
four knives two Dishes one Tureen to her heirs forever
I likewise give my son Fanny Bittler two dishes
four plates and one Tureen to her and her heirs forever
I likewise give my son William Bittler two Dishes four
plates and one Tureen to her and her heirs forever
I likewise give all my silver, Cutlery to be equally divided
between my loving Wife Elizabeth Bittler and my son
Bittler and my son Fanny Bittler to her and their heirs
forever. I likewise give my son Robert Bittler five Shillings
to her and her heirs forever
