Item I give I bequeath with my loving wife Martha Bull my plantation whereon

I now live during her widowhood & when can my said wife should marry again
 I then give the said land to my son Jesse Bull to him & his heirs for ever
 & if my wife should not marry again in my will I desire that she hold the land du-
 ring life & after her decease to my son Jesse Bull to him & his heirs for ever
 I also give my said wife the best bed & furniture & my largest chest & am great
 god & then I do desire to her & her heirs for ever.

Item I give & bequeath to my son Will Bull one bed & furniture one good
 piece of furniture also one piece of land I deliver to him when he is married & one
 cow which articles he hath already received & I give them to him & his heirs for ever.

Item I give & bequeath to my son Benjamin Bull one bed & furniture to him & his heirs for ever.

Item I give & bequeath unto my son John Bull one half of an hundred & fifteen
 acres of land lying on my ridge & the other half unto my son Jesse Bull
 to them & their heirs for ever.

Item I give & bequeath unto my daughter Polly Bull one bed & furniture to her
 & her heirs for ever.

Item I give & bequeath unto my grandson Thomas Givens five hundred current money
 & when can this said Thomas Givens should in my will I desire is to give to
 my son Jesse Bull & his heirs for ever.

Item I give & bequeath unto my son Jesse Bull 2 beds & furniture & all my
 cattle & pigs & such & my will I desire is that all the rest of my estate
 what so ever I have or ever not already with away I give unto my son
 Jesse Bull to him & his heirs for ever & I do appoint my trusty
 & I do appoint my son Jesse Bull whole & sole executor of my will.
