In the Name of God Amen William Bynum of the County of Southampton of the parish of S^t Lukes being sick and weak of body but of sound and disposing Memory do make this my last Will and Testament in manner and form following

I give and bequeath to my Son William Bynum the Land and plantation wherein I now live containing by estimation three hundred Acres to him and his heirs for ever Also I give to my Son William Bynum a Negro girl called and known by the name of Little Lucy to him & his heirs for ever

I give and bequeath to my Daughter Ann my Negro Boy called Jacob and to his heirs for ever provided nevertheless ~~it is my desire that if my Daughter Ann should die without issue of her body her said Negro boy~~ that when the said Negro die Jacob return to my estate and be considered as part thereof and be accordingly divided amongst my Children

I then I give and bequeath to my son John and to his heirs for ever my Negro girl called Amy & also after the death of my beloved Wife Martha I give and bequeath to my son John my Negro called Jimmy to him and his heirs for ever

I Item I bind the use of my Negro Jack Jenny Simon and Rachel to my beloved Wife during her natural life and after her decease I will and require that Jack Simon and Rachel be divided amongst my Children then alive and I do hereby appoint my friends William and John Blunt Executors of this my last Will and Testament revoking all others before by me made In Witness whereof I have hereunto set their hands and affixed my seal this 12th day of November 1773
