brother John Cleveland and all my personal Estate to be sold to pay my debts the remain due
after debts to fall to my brother John Cleveland I Give after my mothers death a Negro
Girl named Liza unto my brother John also give unto my brother John Cleveland a Negro
womans name Ann and if he dies without her all that I have left her to go to my
sister Patsy to her and her heirs forever I make this my last will and testament
revoking all other wills heretofore made by me And I do appoint my friends John
Andrews and Stephen Summers all my whole and sole Executors of this my last Will
and Testament Given Under this the 16th day of December 1775.
