In presence I give and bequeath unto my son Beasant
Crumpler the plantation whereon I now live and all the land
thereunto belonging containing One hundred and 25 Acres
More or less and if he should die without heir legally begotten
of his own body then the said fore said land to be sold and the Effects
of which to be equally divided between all my daughters & septent
Doro Brock to them and their forever. Likewise give unto my son
Wm Crumpler hand mill stone to him & his heirs forever

Item I give unto my ^{son} William Crumpler five shilling Cash
I give unto my son Benja Crumpler five shilling Cash
Also I give unto my Daughter Dorothy Brock five shilling Cash
Item All the remainder of my Estate I give unto my loving Wife
Eliz Crumpler during her life and after her Death

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Thence to Equally divided between my Six daughters Viz Sarah
John, Elizabeth Woodward, Ann Turner, Lucy Crumpler Cherry Crum-
pler, and Mary Crumpler to them and heirs and lastly I do give
my loving Wife Elizabeth Crumpler and my son Descent Crum-
pler my whole and sole Executor to this my Last Will and testament
Dismissing I make & void all other Will as heretofore made by me
