In the Name of God Amen, I William Edwards of the County of Southampton and State of Virginia being of sound and disposing mind and memory thank be given to Almighty God for the same, do make and constitute this my last Will and Testament in form and manner following. To wit.

I bequeath my Wife Sally all my estate real and personal during her life or Widowhood to have and support my two Children Charlotte & George, as also the child or children with which she is now pregnant and my desire is that she should give them out at the time that it should come at the age of twenty one. You are respectfully such part of my personal estate as she may think proper. And being had to an equal Division, and in my desire that at her death, or day of marriage, my whole personal estate be equally divided between my said Children Charlotte and George and such children children as may be born of my said wife Sally some before the date hereof.

Item, I bequeath my said Wife Sally who is now in her pregnancy should be delivered of a Son or Daughter my Land and Plantation which I now live to be equally divided between my two Children George & Charlotte, when he or she shall be a day of marriage; provided he or she be at the age of twenty one years or should have or have a child or children lawfully begotten, but if she should be a Widow of a Daughter, or of a Son who should die in her minority, then give and bequeath the whole of my Land and Plantation being in George and his heirs.

Lastly I do appoint my Uncle George Gurley whole and sole Executor of the my last Will and Testament. A Witness whereof I have hereunto set my hand and seal this 16th day of March 1781 signed by the said published & sealed by the said Will Edwards as of his last Will and Testament in the presence of

At a Court held for the County of Southampton the 13th day of Oct^r 1781 The Will was presented in Court by George Gurley the Executor therein named and proved by the oaths of George Edwards and George Gurley two of the Witnesses thereto and ordered to be Recorded. And on the motion of the said Executor who made oath according to law Certificate is granted him for obtaining a Probate in due form giving Security whereupon &c.
