I also give to my daughter Jane all my household Furniture just Dishes &c. I give her also all my Corn and Wheat that I now have and all that I have to do with for her subsistence also every thing that I have now growing in my garden or field it is my desire that my Estate which little I have I have divided by my three children into three parts my wife taking her part during her life the eldest Gripus is my Executor of and of my
