in Manner & Form followeth.

I give to my Wife Mary a Third Part of my Land to be laid off by John Justice Int.
Cordal Joseph John Blount & John Craft the Also one Silver Spoon one
one Silver and five one Cow & Calf one Feather Bed and Furniture one basin one Dish & one
Plate one Pot one one Tree and Land One Spinning Wheel and one Pair of Cotton Cards one
one one Day of Service during her life, then it to be divided between Thomas & Hulin
I give to my son John the Profits of the Other two thirds of my Land
Item I give my Land whereon I now live to my son William at my Wife's Death and if he die
Without issue of his body lawfully begotten to be Equally divided Between Thomas & Hulin
I give the Land I bought of John Bird to my son Thomas after my Wife's Death and
if he die Without issue of his body lawfully begotten then it to be Equally divided
Between William & Hulin

Item I give my son Hulin my Mill and if he die Without issue of his body lawfully
begotten then it to be Equally divided between William & Thomas

Item I give my Daughter Milly Johnson Two Cows and yearlings Already in her
Possession

Item I give my Daughter Ann Williams One Cow & Calf already in her Possession

Item I give my Daughter Priscilla Phillips one Feather bed already in her Possession

Item I give my Daughter Mary Minger One Feather bed already in her Possession

Item I give my son Isaac Two Shillings

Item I give my son John Five Shillings

Item my Wife's Fellow Thomas to be sold and the Money to be Equally divided be-
tween Ann & John Williams Thomas & Hulin

My Will and Ordre is that the Revenue of my whole Estate not mentioned may
 be sold and the Money to be Equally Divided amongst my Daughters Dances
 Phillis Carter Charlotte Elizabeth and Lucetta
 And I do constitute & Appointe Moses Johnson & Henry Browne my whole &
 Sole Executors of this my last Will and Testament In Witness whereof I have
 hereunto set my hand and seal this seventh Day of April 1779
