whereas my son ^{Wm Feltham} one feather bed & furniture all to them & their heirs

Item

I leave the use of all the remaining part of my estate to my wife during
her life or widowhood & then to be equally divided between all my children

Samuel Samuel William Mary Tabby & Betty Feltham all to them & their heirs

Item

My will is that my son Samuel Feltham be disinterested from the said expences

Lastly

I do appoint my beloved wife Anne & my son Samuel Feltham executors of this
my last will & testament ratifying & confirming this & no other to be my last

by Anne Jelks & Samuel Jelks the executors therein named & proved by the oath of
Peter Parker ^{one of the Justices} who deposed that he saw Gregory Hawley subscribe his name
to the said will & ordered to be recorded & On the motion of the said executors
whereupon oath answering to last certificate is granted them for obtaining

spiritual things in due form giving thanks & Thanksgiving

of four negroes one negro man named Tost Van & Phillis & Judah & one
half of my personal estate during their life or widowhood & the same negro
wench Judah to my son Robert & Phillis to my son Jesse after the death of the
other two negroes of the personal estate to be equally divided among all my
children to them & their heirs forever -

Item I give & bequeath & devise unto my son Jesse Vapen all the land on the north
side of the line where my brother lives beginning at the head of the spring
branch on the river line of markes trees to the swamp to a white oak
also two negroes George & Paddy & forty pounds current money of Virginia
to him & his heirs forever
