my negro man named Cupid which he has now in possession
also my negro ^{man} Harrison & twenty pounds current money to him
& his heirs. It is my will & desire that my loving wife Elizabeth

Jones do live & dwell with my son Samuel Jones & have the
use & her choice of the rooms of the house that I now dwell in
during her life with two good feather beds & furniture with other
things sufficient to furnish the same house & further my will is that
my son Samuel pay unto my wife Elizabeth five pounds current
money a year during her life & after her death the same sum remain
to be given to my son Samuel Jones and his heirs.

Item

I give & bequeath unto my son Samuel Jones the plantation whereon
he now lives and all the land thereunto belonging containing six
hundred & seventy two acres together with the same negroes to him & his heirs forever.
I give unto my son Samuel two negroes to wit Thomas & Harry to him & his
heirs forever. I give unto my son Samuel all the real & personal
estate goods & chattels that I have at the time of my death.

Item I give & bequeath the unto my son Samuel Jones the plantation whereon
I now live and all the land thereunto belonging containing six
hundred seventy two acres to the same more or less to him & his heirs forever
I give unto my son Samuel two negroes to wit Tom & Harry to him & his
heirs forever I give unto my son Samuel all the real & personal
estate goods & chattels to have & to hold to him & his heirs forever

Item I do hereby declare that if either my son Joseph or Samuel should die
before they enter into the state of marriage then the said Joseph & the said
brother to be sole of the money arising from the sale thereof to be equally
divided between the surviving brothers & sisters to wit I do hereby
appoint my son Samuel Jones to be sole executor of this my
last will & testament touching & concerning & making void
all other wills heretofore made by me. Witness my hand & affixed
