Southampton County Wills 1749-1762
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Southampton being very sick & weak in Body but of perfect sense
& memory thanks be to Almighty God for it do make & Declare
this my Last Will & Testament Revoking all former Wills before
made. first & principally I give my Soul to Almighty & my Body
to the Earth to be Buried in a Christian like manner by my
Love hereafter mentioned & as for my Worldly Estate I give as
followeth.

I give to my Daughter Elizabeth Underwood one Negro Woman
named Hannah which I bought of Joseph Godwin & all her Increase
to her & her heirs forever.

I give to my son William Joyner one Negro Woman named Sarah &
one Negro Girl named Patty one Cow but saw of one hundred & twenty
feet less of Land which I bought of Robert Little to him & his heirs forever.

I give to my son Josiah Joyner one Hundred Acres of Land which I took

 this my Last Will & Testament ^{by me} making all former wills before
 made first & principally I give my Soul to Almighty & my Body
 to the Earth to be Buried in a Christian like manner by my
 Executors hereafter mentioned & as for my Worldly Estate I give as

Impress I give to my Daughter Elizabeth Underwood one Negro Woman
named Hannah which I bought of Joseph Godwin & all her Increase
to her & her heirs for ever.

Heirs I give to my son William Joyner one negro woman named Sarah &
one negro girl named Fatty one brood but saw of one hundred & twenty
five acres of land which I bought of Robert Little to him & his heirs for ever

I gave to my son Israel Joyner one Hundred Acres of Land with the Stock
up & one Negro Girl named Hanna to him & his heirs forever

Item I give to my Daughter Ann Dickson one negro Girl named patty with
her Increase to her & her heirs forever

Item I give to my son Lewis Joyner one negro Boy named James & one negro
Girl named Lary with her Increase to him & his heirs forever

Item I give to my son Moses Joyner one negro Boy named Samy & one negro
Boy named Byus & three hundred Acres of Land which I bought of
Benjamin Bradshaw to him & his heirs forever

Item I give to my son Giles Joyner one negro man named Sam only my
wife to have the use of him during her life or widowhood also I give to
my son Giles the plantation whereon I now live & my tract of water
Mill to him & his heirs forever

Item I give & bequeath to my loving Wife Elleanor Joyner all the Rest of my
Estate whatsoever & Whereover & I do hereby Appoint my son Giles
Joyner my whole & sole Executor of this my Last Will & Testament
