I Wm Pope of Southampton County in Virginia being
in full health and disposing mind and memory a calling to mind
the uncertainty of this life and that it is appointed for all
men to die do think proper to make constitute and give this my
last will and testament in manner and form following

Item I give devise and bequeath to my daughter Phebe Pope the
use and profit of all my houses whereon I now live and
as much cleared grounds as she may have occasion for
use of also the privilege for felling fire wood within
one half the profits of my orchard for and during her natural
life or till marriage.

Item I give devise and bequeath to my son John Pope my plantation
and all my lands whereon I am now residing 350 acres or
more to my daughter as above bequeathed & to my son
Wm Pope a free privilege of what timber he may have occasion
of for his own use and for his son I give nothing

life or till marriage.

Item I give devise and bequeath to my son John Pope my plantation
and all my lands whereon I now live containing 350 acres viz
reserving to my daughter as above bequeathed to my son
Wm Pope a free forewille of what timber he may have occasion
of for his own use and for his wife I give unto my son
John and his heirs forever the one handmill & a set of iron
wedges with all my Coopers Tools &c.

Item I give devise and bequeath to my son William Pope all my
shoemakers tools also all my Carpenters tools to him & his
heirs forever.

Item I give devise & bequeath to my daughter Sarah Grace ten
shillings cash to her & her heirs forever.

Item I give devise & bequeath to my daughter Ann Gobb
ten shillings cash to her & her heirs forever.

Item I give devise & bequeath to my daughter Mary Weston

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the sum of two shillings cash to her that lives forever

And I give devise & bequeath to John Lewis the sum of one shilling sterling to him that lives forever.

Item all the rest of my estate of what nature soever after my just debts are paid I give devise & bequeath to my daughter Paphia Pope and to her heirs forever. And lastly I name and appoint my son John Pope to be executor of this my last will and testament writing and disannulling all other wills and testaments by me made directing that this only be taken for my last will & testament no witness my hand & seal this 10th day of June 1755.
