 lowing Negroes viz Carlile Patt & Peter & likewise the half of my
 Cattle hogs sheep horses Household goods & money to him & his

Samuel Josephum unto my loving Brother John Mundell the fol-
lowing Negro viz Carline Butt & Peter & likewise the half of my
Cattle hogs Sheep horses & house hold goods & money to him & his
Heirs for ever only the said Mundell shall pay all my debts out
of his part & I leave in John Mundell's possession the following
Negros which belongs to John Scott & two Tracts of Land one on the
flat Swamp and one on Coxes Swamp & pay the said rents untill
John Scott comes home to possess it and I do hereby appoint John
Mundell my whole & sole executor of this my last will & Testament
