With In the Name of God. I, Wm Washington of
the County of Southampton Longueville do make this my
last will & testament in manner following to wit

I give and bequeath unto my daughter Elizabeth my

share in my house Elizabeth Street London

I give and bequeath unto my daughter Mary five hundred pounds

I give and bequeath unto my daughter Mary Washington five hundred pounds

and unto my wife Sarah Washington the same

wherein I now live during her life I further give unto my said

wife the use of my five negroes Robert Dick James Michel and

James during her life I further give unto my wife the use of

my stock of horses cattle sheep negroes my household furniture and

all interests therein belonging during her life.

I give and bequeath unto my daughter Sarah Washington my

share in my house after the death of my wife the same plantation

and negroes I give her her life I give my daughter the heirs of her

share fully by these presents

I give unto my Cousin Robert Hart full five negroes and

I give unto my Cousin George Washington full five negroes and

unto my Cousin wife Sarah Washington the same

wherein I now live during her life I further give unto my said

wife the use of my five negroes during her life I further give

unto my said wife during her life I further give unto my wife the use of

my stock of horses cattle sheeps hogs my household furniture

all utensils thereunto belonging during her life.

I give and bequeath unto my Cousin Joseph Washington one

half share of the land whereon I now live the same plantation

and negroes given for her life to have my said Cousin the heirs of his

body lawfully begotten forever.

I give unto the executors of my estate full power to execute my

said Cousin Joseph Washington and lastly I do hereby appoint my

said Cousin George Washington my executor of this my last

will and testament In Witness whereof I have hereunto set
