The Deposition of Sarah Gordon aged Fifty seven years or thereabouts
 and Elizabeth Gordon aged Twenty six years or thereabouts Depose
 and saith that on the Twenty sixth Day of September last they
 were in Company with Stephen Herndon Dead, who was in his
 perfect sense at that time but in a low state of health and had
 a great desire of making a will but there being no Person present
 to write it He thought proper to leave his ~~estate~~ by word of
 Mouth as follows. He leaves a Negro Man named Daniel
 to his Mother Mary Gordon. He leaves a Negro Girl named
 Mimoy to his Sister Sarah Herndon. He ^{also} leaves a Negro Girl
 named Asa to be sold to pay his Debts and the overplus
 of what the said Negro sells for more then will pay his
 Debt He leaves to his Brother Joseph Herndon - And that
 on the first Day of October He departed this life
