 this my last will and Testament in manner and form following Viz.
 I bequeath I lend to my loving wife Elizabeth Beverley Stanard
 the Place where I now live and all the land thereto adjoining
 together with my Water Grist Mill and all the utensils thereto
 belonging for and during the term of her Natural Life & after
 her Death I give and Devise the same to my son William Sta-
 nard and to his heirs and assigns forever

Item I give and Devise to my son Larkin Stanard my Tract of land
 in this County called Stanford Whercon Ephraim Beazley my Cousin
 now lives Containing by Estimation One thousand and Eighty Acres
 be the same more or less to him the said Larkin and his heirs &
 assigns forever

Item It is my Will and devise that my Tract of land in the County
 of Middlesex be sold by my Executors hereafter named, after my death
 as soon as the Conveniently can and the Money arising by the
 sale to be applied by my said Executors towards Purchasing a tract
 of land for the Child my Wife now goes with in case the same
 should be a boy which said Tract of Land I further Devise may be bought
 as near to these Parts as can be Conveniently and Advantageously
 so done but in case the said Child should be a girl that then
 and in that case I desire that the Money arising by the said
 sale, may be Equally divided amongst my Wife & all my Chil-
 dren to wit William Stanard, Larkin Stanard, Elizabeth Stanard,
 Mary Stanard, Sarah Stanard, and the Child my Wife now goes
 with. Also further Explain it to be my ———— devise that in case
 the Child my Wife now goes with is a boy that the Tract
 of land to be Purchased for him as aforesaid be Conveyed to him
 in Fee Simple

Item I lend to my loving Wife the Use of one full and Equal third
 part of all my slaves and one Equal and full third part of all my
 Stock of Cattle Horses Hogs and Sheep and all my Household
 furniture for and during the term of her Natural Life and after
 her Death to be Equally divided amongst all my Children already Na-
 med and the Child my wife now goes with and to their Executors
 of their Heirs and Legal Representatives of such of my Children

As may die in the Lifetime of my Wife (forever) all which Land & Slaves and other Estate herein lent to my said Wife (Thereby Express to bind me and full satisfaction of her Deeds)

I Give and bequeath to all my Children herein before named Including the Child my Wife now goes with the other two Third Parts of all my Slaves and Stocks of Cattle Horses Hogs & Sheep to be Equally divided amongst them their and Each of their respective heirs and assigns forever

I Also It is my Will and desire that my Negroes continue on my several Plantations together with the Plantation Tools with Slaves Cattle and every other thing or things for the use of the said several and respective Plantations that may tend to or be of any kind of Service towards the making of this years Crop until the expiration of this year or until the present years Crop be taken & neatly and finally finished and at the End of the Year or finishing of the Crop as aforesaid they may be then appraised according to Law

And in Order to prevent all disputes or Controversies that may arise by the residue of my Personal Estate it is my Will and desire that after my just debts are punctually & honestly paid (which said residue may be of my Estate) I hereby appoint to be the proper fund out of which my said debts are to be paid) if there should be any surplus I desire the same may be Equally divided amongst my Wife and Children and the Child my wife now goes with. And further I desire that my sons William & Larkin Starnard may be put to School and Continue at them until they are liberally and Gentely Educated And Lastly I nominate and appoint my loving wife Elizabeth Properly Starnard Executrix and my son William Starnard when he arrives to the age of Eighteen years Executor of this my Last Will & Testament hereby revoking disannulling & disallowing of all former or other will or Wills by me heretofore made and Ratifying hereby this and this only to be my Last Will and Testament In Witness whereof I have hereunto set my Hand and affixed my seal this Twentieth Day of February in the year of our Lord one thousand seven Hundred and Sixty five
