The Persons appointed to appraise the Estate of John Hawkins
Deceased are agreed to set apart his Widows third according to law

Pursuant To an Order of the Worshipfull Court of Spotsylvania
County dated 7th May 1764 Directed to the Persons that appraised the
Estate of John Hawkins Dec^d to set apart the Widows third accord-
ingly We Do allot unto Elizabeth Hawkins Widow and Relict of John
Hawkins Deceased (as her one full third part of the said John Hawkins
Estate) One Neg^r Man named Jacob, one Neg^roe Boy Names Tommy
and one Neg^roe Girl named Dinah of the Value of one hundred & thirty
Pounds. Twenty one Cattle young and Old one still, one Cart, one
Table and pair of Shillyards to the Value of Forty three Pounds five
Shillings. Apprais^d Also sett apart one third of 381 acres of Land
Begin^g on the River R^e. running thence near a north East Course to the
back line to include one hundred and Twenty seven acres of Land of
the Mansion house. We also find 31st C^t Nett Tob^o. which we refer divi-
ding for payment of the Debt & Funeral Charges. This day was
Produced to us one Neg^roe Woman named Jenny and three ^{negro} children
(her Increase) which Woman was sent unto Elizabeth the Wife of Nicho-
las Hawkins Deceased Father of the Testator by his last Will & Testament.
During her Natural ^{life} for the benefit of the heirs of the said John Hawkins
to whom the 3. Slaves descend after the death of the said Elizabeth. Do
Appraise the said Slaves Vry: The Woman Jenny Now with Child to
Seventy Pounds. Dap^ring to thirty Pounds, Rose to twenty five Pounds
Casper to Twenty Pounds. which are now in Possession of the widow &
Relict of Nicholas Hawkins Dec^d. Given under our hands this 24 day of
May 1764
