of Spotsylvania in the Colony of Virginia being of sound Mind & Memory (thanks
be to God for the same) but considering the uncertainty of human life
to make this my last will & Testament hereby revoking & annulling
and making void all other or former Wills or Testaments by me at
any time here to fore made, & acknowledging this only to be my last
Will & Testament in form & Manner following

I do recommend my Soul into the hands of Almighty God who
gave it, hoping for Pardon & Forgiveness of all my Sins through
the Merits of my blessed Saviour Jesus Christ, my Body I commit
to the Earth to be decently interred at the Discretion of my Executors
hereafter mention in & for what worldly Goods it hath pleased God
to bestow upon me with my just debts are paid & my Funeral Charges
discharged I give & bequeath in manner following

I have made my Will is that my beloved Wife Thebe Julian take
Possession and enjoy the Profits of my whole Estate until the
time that is limited in the following bequest

Item I give and bequeath to my son John Julian the Sill N^o 30
whereon I now live with all the Houses and Appurtenances thereto
belonging, the Sill N^o 8 by the River side bought of Major Roots and
Plantation by the River side containing one hundred & fifty Acres
bought of Major Roots, a Negroe Fellow named Warwick & a Negroe
Wench named Samon, one Wedg of Furniture & one hundred Pounds Cash
When he arrives at the age twenty one years

Item I give and bequeath to my son Henry Wilson Julian the Sill
N^o 1 whereon Thomas Overton & John Shirley now live a Negroe
Boy named Malachia & a Negroe Girl named Dinah one Bed and
Furniture & one hundred Pounds Cash when he attains the age of

Twenty one years of age at the Decease of his Mother M^{rs} Rhea Julian the said Testator
Containing one hundred & fifty Acres which I bought of M^r Charles Dick & M^r
I give & bequeath to my Daughter Esther Julian the sum of three
hundred Pounds Cash immediately after my Decease to be place out on Interest
until she is of age or Marries a Negroe Fellow Named George & Negroe Girl
Named Joyce a Bed and Furniture and six Silver Table spoons at the time
these three hundred Pounds become due

I give & bequeath to my Daughter Kitty Julian three hundred Pounds
Cash a Negroe Wench Named Elizabeth Mulatto Child named Cato a Bed &
Furniture, six Silver Table spoons the Money to be place out & all delivered
her as directed for her sister Esther

I give and bequeath to my Child where with my Wife is now pregnant, a Negroe
Fellow named Jacob and a Negroe Wench Named Phillis

Memorandum It is supposed that after maintaining the Family my
Wife may reserve sufficient for this last Child

I hereby Nominate, Constitute and appoint my Well beloved Wife
Friends Holding Lewis Charles Dick and Francis Thornton Gentlemen
Executors of my beloved Wife Rhea Julian Executive of this my last
Will & Testament

Written at the Request of the said Testator by George Gray Writer in
Fredericksburg & signed by the said Testator the fifth day of March 1764
