Item It is my will that all the rest & remainder of my Estate both real
& personal, that is to say, a tract of Land in Middlesex County containing
one hundred and eleven acres more or less, one feather bed, one black
board, 2 Blankets, 2 Shirts, one coat, one pair of shoes, one pair of
socks, one pair of gloves, one large Chest, with whatever else I may be
possessed of to be sold by my Executors as soon as can be done conveniently after
my death, and the proceeds thereof in Money, Silver or Gold to be made &
Equally after the payment of my funeral Expenses, and one half among
my Children Francis, Elizabeth, Son John, Grace, Susannah, Eliza
I specially do hereby appoint Col. Richard Lewis, my son Francis
Turnley & Charles Yates Executors of this my last will & testament,
herby revoking all former Wills by me at any time made or published
In Witness whereof I have hereunto set my hand and seal this Eleventh
day of April in the year of our Lord one thousand seven hundred and sixty five
