Item I give and bequeath unto my said son Richard one Leather bed &
beam and my house plate and saddle and all my wearing clothes

Item I give and bequeath unto my said son Richard two Cows and a Bull
also two Crows one Sack and two plates of two Shillings

Item I give and bequeath unto my Grandson Ben. Day son of my
Daughter Sarah Fifty pounds current Money

Item I give and bequeath unto my Daughter Sarah One bed and furniture
also Mother trunk also her Mother Mrs. Mathews and to her and
her saddle and Bridle

Item I give and bequeath unto my Daughter Jane Ten pounds and Money

Item I give and bequeath to my Daughter Mary Fifteen pounds Current Money

Item It is my will that the balance of my Estate shall be Equally Divid-
ed between my son Richard and Daughter Sarah

Item It is my will that my sons shall put the fifty pounds given to my
grandson Money to Interest and they shall apply the Interest of
the said Money toward his Schooling and Maintenance

Item It is my will that if my said grandson should die he comes to age
or Marries that the fifty pounds given to him shall go to my
Daughter Sarah

Item It is my will that there shall be no appraisement of my Estate only an
Inventory returned to Court

Item I appoint and constitute my son Richard and my friends Job parish
and Thomas Morris Executors of this my last will and Testament
and lawfully I do revoke and make void all former wills heretofore
Made by me and do declare this to be my last will and Testament

Thomas Minor architect and family boundants Testitans Lewi Chant
Dick John Brooks & Charles Washington gentleman Justice of the County
Court of Spotsylvania now Sealing in the sum of five hundred pounds
current Money to the payment thereof well and truly to be made to
the said Justice and his Surety or we bind our selves and each of
us severally and jointly and severally
by family by these presents sealed with Our Seals this 19th day of
September 1777. The Condition of the above Obligation is such
that if the above bound Richd Woods of York Parish & Tho Minor
Executor of the last will and Testament of George Woods of York do
make or cause to be made a true and perfect Inventory of all and
singular the goods and chattels and credits of the said Test. which have
or shall come to the hands or possession or knowledge of them the
same or into the hands or possession of any other person or persons for
them and the same so made do exhibit or cause to be exhibited unto
the County Court of Spotsylvania at such time as he shall be there
unto required by the said Court and the same goods chattels and credits
of the said Test. dead at the time of his death which at any time after shall
come to the hands or possession of the said Ex^r & to be administered
or disposed of by any other person or persons for him to make
and truly Administer according to law and further to make
