In the name of God amen I Henry Brock of the County of Montgomery being sick and weak but of sound and Perfect mind and Memory, and calling to mind the uncertainty of this Transitory Life do make this my Last will and Testament in manner & form following, that is to say, first and principally I commend my soul to Almighty God, hoping for salvation through the merits and meditation of my blessed Saviour and Redeemer Jesus Christ, and as to what worldly Estate it hath pleased God of his great mercy to Bless me with I give and bequeath in manner and form following

Impious I leave my whole Estate to be kept together By my beloved wife Barbara Brock During her life, & when she remains a widow for her support and maintainance of my Children and after her death or marriage I give & devise my Estate to be Equally Divided among my Children, Joseph, Mary, Hannah, Elizabeth, Harry and John their survivors or Legal Representatives which said Estate of Slave, stocks &c. with their future Increase I give to my said Children their heirs and assigns forever I then I do hereby ordain constitute and appoint my Brother Joseph Brock and my son Joseph Brock Executors of this my last will and Testament, hereby revoking all other will and wills of mine heretofore made In Testimony Whereof I have hereunto set my hand and seal the 24th day of July. 1762

The Condition of this obligation is such that if the above bound Joseph Brock Executor of the last will & Testament of Henry Brock Deed do make or cause to be made a true perfect Inventory of all & singular the Goods Chattles & Credits of the said Deed which have or shall come to the hands possession or knowledge of him therein Joseph Brock or into the Hands or Possession of any other person or Persons for him & the same he made do exhibit or cause to be exhibited into the County Court of Maryland at such time as he shall be thereunto required by the said Court & the same Goods Chattles & Credits of the said Deed at the time of his death which at times after shall come to the hands or Possession of the said Joseph Brock or into the hands or Possession of any other person or persons for him do well and truly Administer according to Law & further do make a just & true account of his actings & doings therein when thereto required by the said Court & also do well & truly pay & deliver all the Legacies contained and specified in the said Testament as far as the said Goods Chattles & Credits will thereto extend according to the Value thereof & as the Law shall charge him then this obligation to be void otherwise to remain in full force & Virtue
