of Spotsylvania being sick and Weak in body being first made
and memory do make this my last will and Testament in man-
ner and form following my body I recommend to the care of my
Soul to a heavenly god who gave it and as to what worldly Estate
it hath pleased god to bestow on me with I bequeath as follows—

I desire that my last debts and Funeral Expenses be first paid
and satisfied—

Then I leave to my loving wife Mildred Ellis during her Widowhood
all my Estate Real and personal and if she the said Mildred
Ellis my wife should Marry it is my desire that she shall
then have One third part of my Estate and the remaining
part to be Equally divided amongst my Children and

there live for ever and of the said Mildred Ellis my wife doth Man-
 ifestly further my desire that at her death the one third part of the
 estate be hers shall return and be equally divided among my
 children and their heirs for ever.

I appoint my loving wife my Brother William Ellis and my
 friend James Lewis White and John E. G. of this my last
 will and testament. In Witness Whereof I have hereunto

 Thousand Seven hundred and Seventy One.

 to be made a true and perfect Inventory of all and singular the goods
 Chattels and Credits of the said Decd which have or shall come to the
 hands possession or knowledge of them the said Mildred Ellis W^m
 Ellis and James Lewis or into the hands or possession of any
