it is further my desire that at her death we and three part of the  
estate under her shall return and be equally divided among my  
children and their heirs for ever.

made to the said Justices and their successors we bind ourselves  
and every of us and every of our heirs executors and administrators  
and successively jointly by these presents sealed with our seals the 16  
day of April 1772.

The Condition of this obligation is such that  
if the above bound Maldred Ellis William Ellis James Lewis &c of  
the last will and testament of Hughie Ellis died do make or cause  
to be made a true and perfect Inventory of all and singular the goods  
Chattels and credits of the said Deed which have or shall come to the  
hands of either or knowledge of them the said Maldred Ellis William  
Ellis and James Lewis or into the hands or possession of any
