Do make and Ordain this my last Will and Testament revoking and making void all other and former wills and Wills by me heretofore made —

Principally and chief of all I Recommend my soul to Almighty God who gave it hoping through the merits of my Blessed Saviour and Redeemer Jesus Christ to find Redemption; my Body to the Earth to be Buried at the discretion of my Executors hereafter named and as touching and Concerning what Worldly Estate it hath pleased Almighty God to bestow upon me I give and bequeath in manner and form following

Item It is my Will & Desire that all my just Debt and funeral Charge be paid —

Item I lend my beloved Daughter, Catey Eske formerly Catey Henoley During her Natural life one Negro Girl called and known by the Name of Hannah whose ~~Granddaughter~~ ^{Granddaughter} my Daughter Deceased my Grand Daughter Patsy Eske to her and her heirs lawfully begotten of her Body forever, and ⁱⁿ Case of such failure (that is) the want of such heirs to return to and be as my other Estate —

Item It is my Will and Desire that all my other Estate both Real and Personal of what kind or sort never be kept together During the natural life of my beloved Wife Martha Henoley and after her Decease to be Equal Divided between my Two Sons John Henoley & James Henoley and their Heirs Respectively forever —

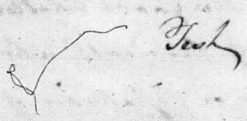
Item It is my Will and Desire that my Two Sons John ^{James} Henoley do live with their Mother Martha Henoley During her Natural Life —

Item I do Constitute and appoint my beloved Wife Martha Henoley Executrix and my son John Henoley Executor of this my last Will and Testament. In Witness whereof I have hereunto set my hand and seal as my last will & Testament this 7. day of January 1765

At a Court held for Maryland County on Monday August the fifth 1765,

The last will and Testament of Samuel Hensley deceased being Exhibited into Court by Martha Hensley and John Hensley Executors therein named, was proved by the oaths of Thomas Perry and Thomas Hutchinson witnesses thereto and ordered to be Recorded, and the said Executors to the usual oath and gave bond with Joseph Hardon and William Wood Sureties for their due and faithful adminⁿ of the said Decedents Estate, and performance of his Will

Know all Men by these Presents that we Martha Hensley John Hensley Joseph Hardon & William Wood are held and firmly bound to Larkin Chew James to Broome Robert Goodloe & John Crane Gentlemen Justices of Maryland County now sitting in the Sum of Eight Thousand Pounds Curr. Money of Virginia to the payment whereof well and Truly to be made to the said Justices and their Successors we bind our selves and Each of us our and Each of our heirs Executors & adm^rs jointly and severally firmly by these Presents sealed with our seals this 5 day of August in the year of our Lord 1765 and in the fifth year of the reign of our sovereign Lord King George the Third —

The Condition of this obligation is such that if the above bound Martha Hensley & John Hensley Es^{rs} & Es^{rs} of the last Will & Testament of Sam^l. Hensley Decd. to make or cause to be made a true and perfect Inventory of all and singular the goods Chattels and Credits of their
