I recommend my soul to god that gave it hoping for his forgiveness of my  
past sins, and as for what worldly estate it hath pleased god to  
Bless me with I give in the following manner, that is to say, I give  
to my sons William Bloomfield, John, Benjamin & Henry Long each  
one his full share of my estate, I give to my  
son owing Long a three years old bay Horse & bridle branded B & as to  
the rest of my estate be it of what nature or kind soever after my  
Just Debts are paid I give to my Loving Wife Mary Long to  
enable her to support and bring up my young Children and  
I do leave her execution of this my Last Will. Witness my hand &  
seal this 4<sup>th</sup> day of March 1763

John Bessley Roy and Gabriel Jones just witnesses thereto ordered to be recorded, and the said  
Executrix took the usual oath and gave bond with John Roy and Gabriel Jones her sureties

In the Name of God amen I John Coleman being in perfect mind  
and memory and calling to mind the uncertainty of this life do  
constitute and appoint this my Last will and Testament in manner  
and form following Revoking all other wills by me made  
I think I send to my beloved wife Rice Coleman during her natural  
Life my Plantation now on Snow Live, with two Hundred acres of Land  
thereto adjoining with five negroes at her and my Executors choice  
and one third of my stock and House hold furniture I then I leave my  
Land whereon John Larson now Lives Bought of John Oliver to be sold  
By my Executors Immediately after my Death to the Highest Bidder  
and the money made of Toward paying of my debts and after my  
Just debts are paid I give the Rest of my Estate both Real and

Reasonable as well my Lands lying or being in what part or parts <sup>(118)</sup>  
soever to be Equally Divided among all my Children that I have or shall  
have and if any of my Children should die before they come of age or  
have Issue then I give their part to be Equally Divided among the  
Part of my Children that shall then be a Live. ~~and if any of my Children should die before they come of age or have Issue then I give their part to be Equally Divided among the~~

I then will the Death of my wife what I have Lent to her. I give to be  
Equally Divided among all my Child. that shall be then a Live or  
the heirs of such as shall be dead of this my Last will I com-  
-tute & appoint my wife Richard Coleman & Samuel Haver  
Executors and Cew. Witness my hand this seventeenth day of  
march one thousand seven hundred and sixty two
