And Memory, and seeing the uncertainty of this Transitory Life
have made this my last will and Testament, in Manner following
First I Recommend my Soul to allmighty God that gave it, in do hereby
Full Pardon of all my sins, and my Body to be Decently buried at the
Discretion of my Exors hereafter mentioned, and as to what Worldly
Estate it has Pleased the allmighty to bestow on me, I leave as follows
Item I Give and bequeath unto my son John Cheiles, Forty Shillings Ster-
ling, Item I Give and bequeath unto my son Henry Cheiles my Land and
Plantation whereon I now live to him and his heirs forever, Item I Give
and bequeath unto my son William Cheiles Part of a tract of Land
I Purchased of W. Baylor, it being laid off to him and to his heirs forever
Item I Give and bequeath unto my son James Cheiles, another Part of
the said Tract it being laid off to him and to his heirs forever Item I Give
and bequeath unto my son Walthe Cheiles Three Hundred Acres of Land
Part of the said tract to be laid off at the Lower End to him and his heirs
Forever, Item I Give and bequeath unto my son Thomas Cheiles
one half of of the remaining Part of the said Tract, to be laid off at the
upper End of Land, to him and his heirs forever, Item I Give and bequea-
th unto my son Benjamin Cheiles the remaining Part of the said
Tract of Land He allowing his sister Susanna Fifty Acres where she
now lives during her Life or as long as she chooses to live on it)
