In the name of God amen I Henry Cheiles of the County of  
Spotsylvania being sick and weak in Body but of Perfect sense Mind  
and Memory and noeing the uncertainty of this Travitory life  
have made this my last will and Testament in Manner following  
First I Recommend my Soul to almighty God that gave it, in to his hands  
full Pardon of all my sins, and my Body to be decently buried at the  
Discretion of my Executor hereafter mentioned, and as to what Worldly  
Estate it has pleased the almighty to bestow on me, I leave as follows  
Item I Give and bequeath unto my son John Cheiles Forty Shillings ster-  
ling, Item I Give and bequeath unto my son Henry Cheiles my land and  
Plantation whereon I now live to him and his heirs forever, Item I Give  
and bequeath unto my son William Cheiles Part of a tract of Land  
I Purchased of H<sup>r</sup> Taylor, it being laid off to him and his heirs forever  
Item I Give and bequeath unto my son James Cheiles another Part of  
the said tract it being laid off to him and his heirs forever Item I Give  
and bequeath unto my son Walther Cheiles Three hundred Acres from  
Part of the said tract to be laid off at the Lower End to him and his heirs  
forever, Item I Give and bequeath unto my son Thomas Barn Cheiles  
one half of of the remaining Part of the said tract, to be laid off at the  
upper End of Land to him and his heirs forever, Item I Give and bequea-  
th unto my son Benjamin Cheiles the remaining Part of the said  
tract of Land the allowing his Sister Susanna Fifty acres where she  
now gives during her life or as long as she chuses to live on it)
