I Richard Long being very sick and weak tho in my proper senses and memory Blesed be God for it But Calling to mind the uncertainty of this life I hereby Recommend my soul to God that gave it me through the merits of his only son Jesus Christ our saviour, and ^{my} Body to be buried at the Discretion of my Executors hereafter mentioned and as for ^{my} worldly Estate that God hath bestowed upon me I dispose of in this manner as followeth Item Give all my Land to be Equally Divided between my six sons that is Gabriel James William Andrew Peubin John I do desire that all my Estate both Real and Personal to remain in the possession of my well beloved wife during her widowhood and after marriage to have an Equal Part with the Children do constitute and appoint my well beloved wife and my son Gabriel and John Garrison Executors this my last Will and Testament Revoking all other as witness my Hand and seal this 11th Day of November 1764
