In the Name of God Amen I Richard Tull of the County of Spotsylvania being of sound Mind and Memory doe Make and ordain this my last Will and Testament in Manner and form following—I give my soule to God that gave it me, I hope of a joyfull Resurrection, and as to my worldly Estate that it hath Pleased God to bless me with all (after my Just debts is payed,) I give in Manner and following Viz

Item I give and bequeath unto my loving Son James Tull four Hundred Acres of Land in Culpeper County adjoining to a Patent of four Hundred Acres granted to my Brother Benjamin Tull which is now myes, son James,

And lying near Muddy Run Mountain, Beginning the dividing line between that four Hundred acres and remaining part of the tract at two Pines and a white oak corner to a Palton of the same tract and running thence North seventy five degrees west to the back or upper line by a line of marked trees I made some years ago to run and his Heirs for ever.

Item I Give unto my loving son Richard Tull two Hundred pounds to purchase that five Hundred acres of Land that Capt. Lewis Davis Yancey and his son Philemon now live on, the Money to be paid out of the Money arising out of the sale of the land he lived in King George to Capt. Yancey according to my agreement with him on his Making good and sufficient Deed to my son Richard for the said five Hundred acres.

Item I Give and bequeath unto my loving son John Tull six Hundred and fifty acres of Land in King George County which I bought of William and John Smith. I also give him Nine Hundred and one teen acres of Land in Culpeper County the remaining part of the tract of Land that I gave my son James his four Hundred acres out of the same more or less I give it with above Hundred and fifty acres to him and his Heirs for ever.

Item I Give and bequeath unto my loving sons Benjamin and Charles Tull all that tract of Land at my home Quarter in Muddy run in Culpeper County containing about twelve Hundred acres to be equally divided between them in quantity and quality as can be, and if either of my said sons should die before the Age of Twenty one years or Part of their Body lawfully begotten then I Give the whole to my said son in the said Land I Give to them and their Heirs for ever.

Item I leave that tract of Land that my son Richard lived on in King George County to be made over to the Vestry of Hanover Parish for a Grave in the Vestry Paying seven Hundred and fifty pounds for it according to my agreement with them, the said Land containing about six Hundred acres to be over by Execution hereafter Named regard be had to make a return for Mary Dowel and her Daughters of about forty Acres during their lives according to my agreement with them.

Item I Give unto my loving son James Tull three Negroes viz. York and Susan, &c. and a Girl Named Lucy. I also Give one water Good Mule, my Clock Desk two Tables and Looking Glass that stand in my Hall to him and his Heirs for ever.

Item I Give unto my loving son Richard Tull six Negroes viz. James and Betty that is now with him and Sam and Hannah and her two

Children Will, and one lately born to him and his Wife for ever
 Item I Give unto loving Sons Benjamin and Charles Tull foure ^{two} Negroes Viz. two boys and ^{two} girls about the age of twelve years or as near as they can be chose out of my Negroes so that age to them and and there heirs for ever

Item All the rest of my Negroes and Personal Estate I Give unto my foure Sones, John, Benjamin, and Charles, to be equally divided between them and that my son James take his part immediately and the rest as they come of age, and if any of my ^{said} foure sons should die before the age of Twentyone years or heirs of their body lawfully begotten that then their parts be divided among the survivors of my said foure sons, all which I Give to them and their heirs for ever

Item My Will and desire is that the Money arising for the sale of my Land in King George after the two Hundred pounds paid to Capt. Gancey for his Land, that my son Richard have one Hundred and fifty pounds to discharge Taxes &c. and that the Three remaining part is goe discharge his debts to me as he stands charged on my book which will amount to near foure Hundred pounds

Item I constitute and appoint my loving Brother James Tull and my loving sons James and John Tull Executors of this my last Will and Testament whom I also appoint Guardians to my younger Children I also direct that my Estate be not appraised In Witness whereof I have hereunto set my hand and Affixed my Seal this twenty second day of January 1766

On second thought I make this my Codicil that is the Hundred and fifty Acres of Land lying in King George County which I bought of William and John Smith in the body of my Will as I have Given to my son John Tull, Now is my Will and desire that my son James Tull have it so better enable him to pay my Debts but in Case there is no necessity to make sale of the Land go to raise money for the discharge of my Debt as above mentioned then it is my desire that the Land shall go to my son John Tull in the same Manner as before Given him in the body of my Will Witness my hand and Seal this Ninth Day of January 1767

The Condition of the above obligation is such that whereas the above bound Tho. McNeil on the Day of - in a Suit brought by the said Tho. McNeil against the said Gab. Jones J. in the County Court of Spotsylvania & a Jury being thereon had returned a Verdict for the said Gab. Jones J. prayed an Injunction to stay further proceedings therein till the said Suit should be heard in Equity now the force of the said Gab. Jones J. be cast in the said suit & doth satisfy and pay such Sum or sums of money & Charges Costs and Damages which may then hereafter shall hereafter become due to the said McNeil and also the costs and shall be awarded against him in case the said Injunction be dissolved then this obligation to be void otherwise to stand firm and of full force Power and Virtue
