Item I Give unto my beloved wife Mary Quier during her natural life (or
 widowhood) the Land and Plantations wherein I now live containing three
 hundred & fifty four Acres, more or less and at her decease or marriage I
 give the same to my sons Thomas & Henry Quier, to be equally divided
 between them, to them and their heirs forever, I also lend unto my said
 wife during her natural life or widowhood one negro man named Peter & one
 negro woman named Will, and after her decease or marriage, I desire that
 the said two negroes and their future Increase may be equally divided between
 my four following Children and their legal Representatives, viz: Joseph,
 Thomas, William Lucy and Henry Quier, to them and their heirs
 forever Respectfully, And I do also give unto my said wife her Choice of Two
 feather beds and furniture, Two Cows, Calves, her Choice of any horse or
 mare I have, & her said saddle & bridle and her heirs forever —

Item I Give to my son William Quier one negro boy named Sammy and one negro
 girl named Frank to him and his heirs forever —

Item I Give to my Daughter Lucy Quier, one negro woman named Sarah and one
 negro girl named Will, and one feather bed and furniture, to her & her heirs forever —
 I Give unto my son Henry Quier one Negro girl named Kate and one negro boy named
 Dick, and one feather bed and furniture to him and his heirs forever —

Item I Give unto my wife Daughter Sarah Mugglesworth one feather bed and furniture —

Item I Declare that all the remainder of my Estate (not herein disposed off) may be
 Equally divided between my wife if then living, and my Children, Joseph, Thomas,
 William, Lucy and Henry Quier, to them and their heirs forever Respectfully,
 And Lastly, I do hereby constitute and appoint my loved wife Mary Quier,
 my son in Law Edward Stander and my son Joseph Quier Executors and
 Executors of this my Last will and Testament, In Witness whereof I have
 hereunto set my hand and seal this fifth day of May one thousand
