Imprimis

I desire that my first Dible and Funeral Expences be first paid & satisfied

I then

I give and bequeath to my Daughter Mary Proctor one negro woman Lucy and all her future Increase and all other things that she has of my Estate in her Possession to her and her heirs forever

I give and bequeath to my Negro man Huzekiah Ellis one negro woman Lucy and all her future Increase together with all other things that he has of my Estate in his Possession to him and his heirs forever

I give and bequeath to my daughter Ann Oneal one negro woman ^{named} Silvia together with her future Increase one side saddle to be purchased out of my Crop now growing to the Value of four Pounds per bush or six Pounds and all other things that she has in her Possession of my Estate to her and her heirs forever

I give and bequeath to my daughter Elizabeth Hartwells one Negro girl named Milly and all her future Increase together with all other things that she has of my Estate in her Possession to her and her heirs forever

I Give and Bequeath to my son William Ellis one negro man named Tom the age of
all other things that I have Given of my other Estate to him and his heirs for ever
I desire that my Esq^r will purchase a young negro worth out of the money due to me
and my Copes hereafter arising and if that is not sufficient to sell so much of Esq^r
as will be sufficient which said negro I give unto John Ellis to him and his
heirs forever Selle Give to my said son John the Choice of my Negroes when he arrives
to the age of Twenty years at which time I desire he may be free as also our
Cows and Calves two Cows and Lambs one father and two heifers and as also
fifty Shillings Price to be paid for cost of Transportation & his heirs forever
I desire my Esq^r will purchase a young negro worth out of the money due to me
and my Copes as will be sufficient to sell so much of my Personal
Estate as will be sufficient which said negro I give to my daughter Agnes
Ellis to her and her heirs forever I also give to my said Agnes uter shire
of an or manies two Cows and Calves two Cows and Lambs one father
Bred and furnished and a side Saddle to be her hand and of my Crops of the Field
four Pound ten Shillings or four Pounds to her and her heirs forever
I add to my loving wife during her widowhood one negro fellow Peter one negro
fellow Jack one negro fellow George Angola both Phillips I myself to my son Charles
Bob Schmid and Alice and their Increase also all my household goods and
furniture and all my stocks of all kind that I have not given away and other
such things where of the slaves I don't know wife to be divided among all my Child
or their Legal Representatives to them and their heirs for ever and as to the division
that my son George shall have his first choice of Lots & of my son William hence
hence afterwards according to the age of my Children and Marcell there to be
my Estate to be divided into two months Credit and that only the value more of the
the lots of the negroes to be made equal and the Balance to be Equally Divided among
my said Children or their Legal Representatives
If my wife should die before my son arrives to the age of Twenty years I desire
that Robert Neal may take his Estate into his Possession until he arrives to
the age of Twenty years & that he be accountable for no more than the Profits
here of towards my said Son John's Maintenance and if he should not
choose to stay with the said Neal without Exp^r I then my Exp^r
bind him to the said Neal until the age of Twenty years
If my wife should die before my daughter Agnes Arrives to age or marries
that then my son George shall take her Estate into his Possession until she
arrives to age or marries and be accountable for no more than the Profits here of
towards her Maintenance
lastly I Appoint my loving wife my friend Col. Joseph Wren to my son

Ellis into the hands or Possession of any other Person or Persons for whom and the same
determined to hold or cause to be exhibited into the County Court of Pennsylvania at such
time as shall be then unto required by the Court and the same Goods Chattels and Credits
and all other Goods Chattels and Credits of the D^r Deed at the time of his Death which at
any time after shall come to the hands or Possession of the said Elizabeth Ellis William Ellis and Richard
Ellis into the hands or Possession of any other Person or Persons for him to sell and Truly
Administer According to Law and further to make a just & true account of his Debts &
Duties wherein there do require by law to be paid and also to be paid Truly pay
