of Two hundred and fifty pounds Virginia Currency to her and her heirs forever
All the rest of my Estate both real and personal of every kind whatsoever I give and bequeath
and devise to my two natural and reputed Sons Hugh Wright Alias Houston and
William Wright Alias Houston (which said Hugh and William were born of the body
of my deceased wife Elizabeth before my intermarriage with her and out of lawfull
wedlock) to them the said Hugh and William and their heirs forever
I appoint my beloved Friend Mr Charles Gates and my said Sons Hugh and
William Executors of this my will and I desire my said Sons to follow the advice of
my Friend Mr Gates in all things which I hope they will do for their own good
and in regard to the respect they owe to my memory having spared no pains to provide
