In the Name of God Amen.

I William Miller of the County of
Spotsylvania and Parish of Saint George being very sick and weak in
Body but of mind and Memory sound and perfect assayual to make
this my last will and Testament in Manner and form following to
wit as I recommend my soul to God who gave it and my Body to the
Earth to be buried at the Discretion of my Executors hereafter named
as to what worldly Goods it hath pleased the Almighty to bestow me
given in Manner and Form following

Imprimis it is my will and Desire that all my just Debts and Fun-
eral Expenses be first satisfied and Paid.

Item my will and desire is that my beloved wife Jane Miller shall have the
use of all my Estate both Real and Personal during Natural life, and
after her Death to be disposed of as follows

Item I give and bequeath to my grandson William Miller Bledsoe the land
and Plantation whereon I now live, together with all the Land which
at the time of my Death I shall have adjoining the same, but in case
my said wife should die before my said grandson comes of age then my
desire is that my Daughter Betty enter into Possession and have the
possession of the said Land and Plantation during the Minority of the said William
Miller and that at the time of his coming to the age of Twenty one years he
shall be entitled to the same rotrected and I hereby confirm to him and
the Heirs of his Body lawfully begotten forever. Nevertheless if the said
William Miller Bledsoe should die without issue of his body I give
the said Land to his Brother Moses Bledsoe and his heirs and assigns
forever

Item I give and bequeath to my grandson William Miller Bledsoe, Miles
Bledsoe and Moses Bledsoe all my Land in Orange County to be

equally divided amongst them in Quantity and Quality and it is
 my desire that if my wife should die before either of them come of age
 that then my Daughters Mary & Betty Enter into Possession of the said
 Land and have the same equally divided Between them to hold the
 same with all Benefit and advantage accruing therefrom in possession of
 the said Children come of age and then I desire it may be divided into
 three equal parts as above mentioned if the Eldest to take his part
 the Remainder to be still kept by my said Daughters till the next
 coming of age of one of the said Children & should die before they come to the age
 of Twenty one years then and in that case I hereby Impose my
 Executor or the Survivor of them to sell the part belonging to such
 Child and the Money arising by such sale to be equally divided among
 the surviving Brothers and Sisters of the Deceased

Item I give and Bequeath to my beloved wife Jane Miller one Negro girl
 named Sylvia to be disposed of as she thinkes fit

Item after the Death of my wife my will and Desire is that all the remainder
 of my estate be Equally divided Between my Daughters Mary &
 Betty which total I lend unto them during their Natural lives, and
 when Deceased I desire the same may be equally divided Amongst their
 Children Proportionately, that is the Children of each mother to
 Divide the Estate Left to the Mother

Item my desire is that my executors be satisfied for their trouble out of my estate
 lately I do hereby Ordain Constitute and Appoint my beloved wife Jane Miller
 and my friends Edward Johnson and Joseph Hanson Executive and
 Executors of this my last will and Testament hereby revoking all other
 wills by me heretofore made in Testimony Whereof I have hereunto set
 my hand & Seal this 21st day of October 1766.
