

In the Name of God amen. I Zachary Lewis of Spotsylvania County being sick and weak but of sound and perfect Mind & Memory Thanks therefore be given to almighty God. I make and Ordain This my Last Will and Testament in manner and form following. First, I bequeath my soul to God hoping for Pardon of my sins through the Merits and Sufferings of my blessed Lord and Saviour Jesus Christ, my Body I yield to the Earth to be buried in such decent Christian Burial as my Executors herein after mentioned shall see meet but would have no Funeral Sermon and as to all such worldly Estate and both blessed God to bestow as Hee I give desire and bequeath the same as followeth;

First, I give and devise unto my son John all my Lands and Tenements adjoining to the place whereon I now live in Spotsylvania County to him and his Heirs forever

Item, I give and devise unto my son Walter all my Land & Tenement lying on Pamunkey River in the said County which I purchased of Mr. Joseph Thomas, Robert Turner and Nathaniel Jones to him and his Heirs forever

Item, I give and Devise unto my son Benjamin my Water Mill & Mill Race lying on Arnold's Run in the said County containing about or above four hundred and Seventy Acres to him and his Heirs forever

Item, I give and Devise unto my son John all a half Acre of Land lying on Fulling Mill and all the utensils made use of about the same in grinding Meal in fulling, Dyeing, Lyeing and Bleaching of Cloth and also the Dyes which I have provided for the use of the said fulling Mill and all the Lands thereunto adjoining which I purchased of the Ballhays lying in the County are sold to him and his Heirs forever

Item, I give and Devise unto my son John a half Acre of Land lying on a road which I purchased of Graves and returned to them and their Heirs forever to be held in Common as it will be Necessary for them to have him and to take off the said land for the use of their other Pasture land

Item, I give and Devise unto my son John, Zachary Waller and Benjamin all my Lands and Tenements lying in Culpeper County at the great Mountains to be Equally divided among them to them and their Heirs forever This last Devise is not intended to be all Legatenary, I give my two wheel Chair and Harness and two Chisel Hammers to my beloved wife Mary my Books except what are my wives and all my wearing Cloths I give to my four sons John, Zachary, Walter and Benjamin to be Equally

Divided among them, my Household and Kitchen Furniture I order
 to be kept together until the Death of my Wife for her use and the
 Use of my Children that shall live with her, and at her Death
 I give the same to my four Sons John, Zachary, Waller and Benjamin
 to be Equally Divided among them. I desire that my said four Sons
 settle my Books and receive my out standing Debts for which
 they are to retain in their ^{own} hands to their own proper Use Ten ff. Cent.
 for their Trouble. I give and bequeath my three stills for Distilling
 Brandy unto my four Sons John, Zachary, Waller and Benjamin
 and of the Brandy by them to be made I give to Each of my Daugh-
 ters Merisother Betty Littlepage, Lucy Ford and Dorothea Smith
 thirty Gallons as the same can be made my Sons not to be obliged
 to pay it all in one year but as they find it convenient, my four
 Violins I give to my sons John, Zachary, Waller and Benjamin,
 I give unto my son Zachary my Negro Man Morgan to him and his
 Heirs I give unto my son Waller my Negro Boy Sam to him & his Heirs
 I give unto my son Benjamin my Negro Man Soverne to him and his Heirs
 I give unto my sons Zachary, Waller and Benjamin a Feather Bed
 and Furniture, I lend unto my Daughter Betty Littlepage one Negro
 Girl out of those I last bought during her Natural Life, and imme-
 diately after her Death the said Negro and her Issue if any I give
 to be Equally Divided among my said Daughters Children then living
 and their legal Representatives but in case they should all dye
 without Issue living in the Life time of my son in law James Little-
 page then the said Slave and her Issue to go to the said James
 Littlepage. my Will is that my Black Smiths Tools be kept
 together where they are for the joint Use of my beloved wife, Mary
 and my four Sons John, Zachary, Waller and Benjamin during
 the Life of my said Wife and at her Death my son John to have
 the same paying my other Children proportionable part of their
 value. my will and Desire is that my sons Zachary and Waller
 have their Grain Ground at my son Benjamin's Mill Toll free
 they allowing him Necessary Limbers off their Lands to rebuild
 and repair the said Mill when Necessary as also to assist in
 Repairing the Dam &c when Necessary, my Nulatto man Charles
 and my Negroes Sam and Pralich are to be kept by my said
 wife and my four sons John, Zachary, Waller and Benjamin
 During my said wife's Life for their Equal Use in building on

And Repairing Houses, Mills making and repairing, Iron Works &c. to be
 on or for the use of their several Plantations but these Slaves are
 to be reckoned Part of that Lot among the Slaves which I shall send
 to my said Wife and at her Death to go as I shall by this my Will
 give the other Slaves at her Death which I shall send her, after my
 just Debts are paid. I send unto my said Beloved Wife during
 her Natural Life the following Slaves (To wit) Milatto (Charles Beloe
 James these three to the deceased to keep in this my Will
 Also Silvia and her son Isaac Lively (Charlotte Lucy both sent
 Candace, Milly, Anderson, Thos. Captain, Ester Dinah &c. &c.
 and from and immediately after her Death I give the said Slaves
 and all their Increase unto my four sons John, Zachary, Haller
 and Benjamin Equally to be divided among them to them & their
 Heirs forever I also send unto my said Wife one fifth Part of all
 my Stock of Cattle Hogs Sheep and Horses and also one fifth Part
 of my Personal Estate not herein before disposed of during her
 Natural Life and after her Death I give the same to be Equally
 Divided among all my Children then living and their legal Repre-
 sentatives all the Rest of my Slaves and Personal Estate not
 herein before disposed off to be divided into Eight Equal Parts
 one part whereof I give to each of my Children - Viz. John
 Zachary, Haller, Benjamin, Mary, Lucy Dorothea and their Heirs
 forever the other Eighth Part I send unto my Daughter Betty
 during her Natural Life and immediately after her
 Death I give the Slaves and their Increase and the said Personal
 Estate unto her Children then living and in case any of them be
 Dead to their legal Representatives but in case all her Children
 should dye in the Life time of my son in law James Littlepage
 then the said Slaves and Personal Estate to go to him as I have already
 given my Daughters Mary and Lucy Part of my Estate and have
 given nothing to my Daughter Betty and Dorothea except what I
 have given them by this my Will therefore it is my will that
 my Daughters Betty and Dorothea in the division of my Personal
 Estate each of them have forty Pound out of the Part of my Dau-
 ghters Mary and Lucy in order to make each of my Daughters

Parts of my Estate as Equal as possible, I nominate constitute
and appoint my sons John, Zachary, Waller, and Benjamin
to be my Executors of this my last Will and Testament Resolv-
ing all other Wills by me heretofore made and my Desire is
that my Executors be not obliged to give Security for the
Performance of their Executorship and I desire my Friend Mr.
John Waller my wives Brother to be aiding and assisting my
Executors in the Division and settling my Estate and desire
my sons to divide and settle my Estate among all my Deceases
and Legacies in a Friendly manner with the least Expence
that may be, Declaring this to be my last Will and Testament
In Witness whereof I have hereunto set my hand and seal
this seventh Day of July in the year of our Lord one thousand
seven Hundred and sixty four
