And first and principally I bequeath my soul to God that gave it trusting in the Alone Merits of my ever blessed Saviour Jesus Christ, my Body to be Christianally Interred by my Exe. hereafter named & as to my worldly Estate after all Just Debts paid I dispose of as followeth Viz:

Item The tract of land whereon I now live in Broctonylvania County to be sold and the Money arising therefrom to be applyd for the use of ^{my} Estate and the Bringing up and Educating my Children - Item I give and Bequeath unto my son Richard Bullard all that tract of land lying in Caroline County to him and his Heirs forever he not disturbing his Mother of her life in the said Land. Item I give and unto my Beloved wife all my other estate whatsoever for her ~~life~~ ^{life} (provided she live a Widow) and after her decease to be Equally divided among such of my Children that shall be then living. but in case she should ~~have~~ ^{have} my Will is that the Estate of be Equally divided, as soon as it conveniently can, ^{my wife holding a} Child or two only, among my Children to be lodged in my Exe. hands till my Children shall ~~have~~ ^{have} come to the age of twenty one years - Item I give ^{me} to my beloved Friend Richard Woolfolk my young black horse called Gift as a legacy -

And lastly I create and ordain my Beloved Wife Betty Bullard and my Brother Richard Woolfolk to be hole and sole Exe. of this my last will and Testament as Witnesses my hand seal this 30th day of July 1754 -

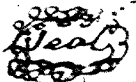
