Mary if any of it left. I do Give unto my son Samuel Warren the Feather bed

and furniture as I Lay in and of Money as John Jarvis is Owring of me I

Constitute and Ordain and Divide my son Samuel Warren my son in law

Thomas Bangis to be my Executor of my Estate and to Receive all my Debts that

is out and the Rest of my Estate to be Equally Divided Amongst all my children

And it is my Desire that my ^{last} will shall not be Brought to Appraisment
This Certificate and Order my Last will and Testament attests my
hand and seal this 21 day of February 1750/1
