be Interred in Christian Burial at yr Discretion of my Executors
hereafter named & for what worldly Goods God in his infinite
Mercy hath been pleased to bestow upon me I give by bequeath
same as followeth

Singl^r. It is my will that all my Just Debt of Funerall Expence
Shall be first Satisfy'd by paid
From I send unto my beloved wife During her whole life the
Plantation whereon I now live & the third part of the land
There unto belonging & one negroman named Peter.

One Negressman named Hannah one Dillo named Anne
 Further bed & furniture three Cows & Calves One sheep
 And hawks one Pewter Dish & three grist mill
 I give & bequeath unto my son Robert Goodloe & to his heirs & assigns
 For ever the tract of Land whereon I have lived only my beloved wife
 to have her life in use & plantation & third part of the give unto my
 son Robert Goodloe & his heirs & assigns forever my tract of Land in Amelia County
 Virginia Smith bought of my tract of Land in Amelia County
 Negro & Slave vizt. Saml. & Matt. Man & woman & Jany the three Negro
 Slaves heretofore sent to my beloved wife after her Decease
 I give & bequeath unto my Daughter Eliza both now the wife of Robt
 Durrett one Negro boy named Cook her and her heirs forever
 I give & bequeath unto my Grand Daughter Elizabeth Man in one
 Cow & Calf & two horses & carriage & my to her heirs
 That all the Dividues & Remainder of my Estate of what kind so ever
 I have including the personal Estate that my beloved wife & I
 have with us to be equally Divided between my beloved wife
 Eliza both now wife of Robt D. & me now wife of
 John Durrett & Catherine now the wife of John Durrett to them
 & their heirs forever
 I appoint & constitute Robt Durrett & Robt Goodloe
 my single & sole executor & trustee to be by them
 & their heirs & assigns to do all such things as shall be necessary
 to give & perform this my last will and testament in full
 & I have hereunto set my hand & seal this 26. day of Nov. 1748
