in Manner & form following

First my will is that my just Debts be paid by my Executors hereinafter
Mentioned

I give & bequeath unto my loving wife Mary Fox my plantation in
Prince William County whereupon Wintholt lives and two hundred
and fifty acres of Land thereunto adjoining during her Natural life
Likewise I give unto my said wife the use of four Slaves named Breechy
& Oranger Flora & Dinah during her Natural life and after her decease
I give the said Land & Slaves to my kinsman James Fox and his heirs
forever

Item My will is that all my personal Estate be Equally divided between
my ^{life} loving & my kinsman James Fox ^{except my working} ~~smiths~~ tools which
I give to my kinsman James Fox
All the best of my Land & Negroes & other Estate both Real
& Personal I give to my kinsman James Fox & his heirs forever

From My will is that my Minoman James Fox do convey unto John Triplett the Land in King George County which I have bargained with him for the said Triplett paying the Consideration Money Agreed on for the same

Lastly I do Nominate constitute Ordain & Appoint my loving wife Mary Fox and my Minoman James Fox Executors & Administrator of This my last will and Testament & do revoke all other wills & Testam. by me heretofore made In Witness whereof I have hereunto set my hand & seal this 10th day of January 1749

my soul into the hands of God who gave it me hoping for pardon &
Remission of all my sins through the Merits of Jesus Christ and
As for my Body I becommend it to the Earth to be decently buried at
the discretion of my Executors hereafter mentioned and for the worldly
