Parish in King William County & Colony of Virginia being
Sick and Weak of Body but of perfect mind & Memory
Knowing that all men are mortal & that this my last will
and Testament in form & manner following first I give by
bequeath my soul in to the hands of all mighty & merciful
hoping & no ways Doubting thro the mediation of my blessed
Redeemer & Saviour Jesus Christ to receive the same again
at the Generall Resurrection and as for my worldly Estate
Wherewith it hath pleased God Almighty to bless me with all I do
hereby give and bequeath the same in manner and for
as followeth I commend my Body to be Buried in a Christian
Buriall according to the direction of my Executors here
after mentioned

I order & desire that all my Just are paid satisfied
and my Funerall Charges Discharged & then I give and
bequeath as followeth

I Give and bequeath unto William Holladay and to his
heirs & assigns for ever Two hundred Acres of Land Where
Thomas Gistain formerly lived and also a Negro Woman
named Sheba & her Increase

Item I Give & Bequeath unto my son Joseph Holladay and to his heirs and assigns for ever Three Hundred acres of land Lying & being on the last side and a long Mill Dam - also a Negro man named Cane & his wife named Nam & her Increase

Item I further Give unto my said son Joseph and to his heirs and assigns for ever One half part and profits of my Mill also four Cows & Calves with a feather Bed & Furniture one Iron pot & a large pewter Dish

Item I Give & Bequeath unto my son Benjamin Holladay and to his heirs & assigns for ever Three Hundred Acres of land Lying and being on the west side & along the mill Dam Also a negro Man named Peter & his wife named Grace & her Increase
