Knowing that all men are mortal & that this my last will
and Testament in form of manner following first I give by
bequeath my soul in to the hands of all mighty & mercifull
hoping by no waye Doubting thro the mediation of my blessed
Redeemer & Saviour Jesus Christ to receive the same again
at the generall Resurrection and as for my worldly Estate
Wherewith it hath pleased God Almighty to bless me with all I do
hereby give and bequeath the same in manner and for
as followeth I commend my Body to be Buried in a Christian
Buriall according to the direction of my Executors here
after mentioned

I desire that all my Just are first satisfied
and my funerall Charges Discharged by them I give and
bequeath as followeth

Item I Give and Bequeath unto my son Daniel Halladay and to his heirs & assigns for ever Two hundred acres of land where now my said son lives

Item I Give & Bequeath unto my son Joseph Halladay and to his heirs and assigns for ever Three hundred acres of land lying & being on the east side and a long Mill Dam - also a Negro man named Eben & his wife named Nam & her Increase

Item I further Give unto my said son Joseph and to his heirs and assigns for ever one half part and profits of my Mill also four Cows & Calves with feather Bed & Furniture one Iron pot of chalk and one large pewter Dish
