Item. My Will and Desire is that the Remainder of my Estate may be equally divided amongst my seven children as I have not given any - go to viz. James, Thomas, Winifred, Susannah, Elizabeth, Agnes, and Mary. My Desire is that my Son Benjamin may be sent to school by my Estate till he has good learning and then to bind him to a good trade till he shall reach to the age of twenty years.

And lastly of this my last will and Testament I ordain and appoint my Loving Son James Pulliam to be Executor of this my last will and Testament.
