performing what is written in such cases certificate is
granted her for obtaining a probate hereof in due form.

Court 16. Feby 1750

In the name of God Amen I Anthony
Memory of Stafford County do now being sick & weak in
body but of perfect sound Memory blessed be God for the
same & desirous by declaration make Ordinance this the
viiij day of February 1750 now living & unwilling and
making void all other wills by me made in the following
manner. Test. I recommend my soul to God who gave it in
hope for a free pardon for my sins at the resurrection and
my body to be decently buried at the discretion of my Executors
hereafter named. In dairies owned, Estate which God
blessed. Please to blessed with disposal of in this
following manner giving all my Estates except one hundred
and eighty four acres of Land in Caroline County and
a negro following and Maggy to be equally divided
between my living children young son & children
serving my debts & balance of the said estate

Should die without a lawful heir then such child depart
shall be Equally divided among the rest my wife or that
at my wife's Death her part shall be divided Equally among
the children. Here I give & bequeath to my son John
his Slave & the Lands above mentioned in Lincoln County
and he shall die without direction my dominions shall
be sold at public Auction to the highest bidder for the use
to be Equally divided among the rest of my Children.

All my desire is that the above mentioned legacy &
Wagerry be laid out to support the Schooling of my
maidenhead of my son John and his descendants
henceforth what the said Wagerry shall come shall be
Equally divided among the rest of my Children. Also
my desire is that the following things may be sold to meet
the Support of my Family & Friends no body of them will
adoke a place professed of a Club of Drunks & Draymen must be
An Oldest & do constitute & appear my brother
Richard Murray my Friend Richard Ethelton & John
whole owners of the property left with me at my death
Witness whereof I have caused to set my hand & seal
this 24th day of October One thousand seven hundred and
forty eight. R. Murray

And Lastly I do constitute & appoint my brother
Richard Murray my Trustee & hold him in being
whole & master of the money last will & Testament left

this 24th day of October One thousand seven hundred and
forty eight. John Murray
